McGuinty Government Invests In Data Collection Project

The Municipality of Greenstone and other small towns in the Northwest will soon have a new tool to help them get the information they need to plan for their communities.

The Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation (NOHFC) is providing \$299,000 to the Geraldton Community Forest organization to implement a password-protected system that will help users collect data and share information in a secure fashion over the Internet.

The Community GIS (Geographic Information Systems) Solution project will be a valuable tool for municipalities as they guide the future growth of their communities.

- The 2008 Ontario Budget commits to increase annual funding to the NOHFC by \$10 million a year from \$60 million in 2007-08 to \$100 million by 2011-2012.
- This NOHFC investment is provided under the <u>Emerging Technology Program</u> which is designed to encourage both the private and public sectors to develop exciting and viable new technologies that will contribute to future northern prosperity.
